## Student Safety Coalition (SSC) Fort Hamilton's HOW TO Guide

The Student Safety Coalition bands students together to create a safe school environment and to raise awareness around the issue of gun violence in schools.

## We work to:

- Keep students updated about current events as they relate to gun violence
- Teach students techniques about how they can protect themselves / how they should respond in case of an emergency at school
- Teach students techniques about how they can help intervene if they are concerned a student may commit a violent action (Direct & Guide to support)
- Bring expert and guest speakers to talk about this issue in schools
- Provide opportunities to organize and participate in student activism around gun violence

To set up a Student Safety Coalition in your school, you should...

- 1. Bring a core group of students supporters together and vote for your group leader
- 2. Reach out to a staff member and ask them to be your school advisor
- 3. Reach out to Students Demand Action to learn how they can support your efforts in school
- 4. Elect a Student Leader (or two!) for your group
- 5. Reach out to Students Demand Action to learn how they can support your efforts in school
- 6. Set clear expectations and goals for what you hope to accomplish with the SSC at your school
- 7. Do some research to learn about what your school is already doing (or not doing) to address the issue of school safety and gun violence in your community
- 8. Brainstorm some steps and solutions your school could take to improve safety in your school
- 9. Present your findings and ideas to classes and school leadership in an effort to create a safer environment in your school
- 10. Work with Students Demand Action to organize an assembly to raise awareness about this issue at large
- 11. Put together a short video to raise awareness in your community about your work!
- 12. Develop pamphlets, flyers, and posters to let other students in your school know about your efforts
- 13. Build a social media presence to engage in national events around the country
- 14. Invite guest speakers to come and educate your school community
- 15. Always work with your student group to think about ways you can make a difference and get involved with the Student Lead movement to end gun violence around the country!
